Year 1

Weekend study – 3 consecutive days at UWE Bristol, followed by 5 weekend sessions at your chosen regional centre

Assessment

Students have examinations in all 7 Foundation subjects and coursework in some of those subjects. All examinations take place in mid June apart from the English Legal System, which takes place in October of the first year. Examinations are closed book with the exception that an un-annotated statute book may be taken into the examination. The coursework and IRP submission dates are announced at the start of each study year.
